What is Perfect the Pontiac Parks and how can you help?

On April 8th of 2016, the Leaders of the Future and the Friends of the Pontiac Parks Association are joining forces with the City of Pontiac and Oakland University to cleanse Pontiac's six major recreational parks in a single afternoon. From 12:00pm to 2:00pm, OU students and faculty, Pontiac high school students and staff, and Pontiac community members will manage and enact a thorough spring cleaning of Hawthorne Park, Perry Park, Murphy Park, Oakland Park, Beaudette Park, and Galloway Lake Park. Catering for Volunteers

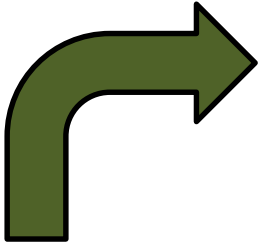
Community service is hard work. Volunteers at the Perfect the Pontiac Parks day will be actively engaged in park clean-up and park repairs, picking up trash and installing new wood chips and cleansing the space. We'd like to provide lunch for the hard-working volunteers. We are expecting 300 volunteers, and so at \$5 per lunch, the total costs of catering for Perfect the Pontiac Parks day would be \$1,500.

To Fund Catering for 10 Volunteers = \$50

To Fund Catering for 100 Volunteers = \$500

To Fully-Fund Catering for Volunteers = \$1,500

Community Service Supplies



Bottle caps, loose bottles, and other pieces of refuse litter many Pontiac Parks.



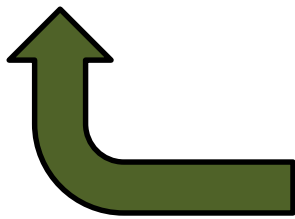
Shovels, gloves, rakes, trash bags, medical kits, and other tools are all necessities for a major park clean-up. The more tools the merrier! A package of all items listed above, at \$100 each, will be needed for each of the six Pontiac parks, and so \$600 will cover the costs for all supplies needed at the event.

To Fund a Single Pontiac Park = \$100.

To Fully-Funded Community Service Supplies = \$600.

Pontiac Park Improvements

A play structure at Jaycee Park in Pontiac is coated with graffiti and the playground is suffocated with grass and weeds.



Play structures at many Pontiac Parks have fallen into disrepair. The appearance of the structures can be immediately improved by removing graffiti and installing new wood chips in the playground of the play structures. For each park, \$200 would cover the costs to remove graffiti and install new wood chips.

To Fund a Single Pontiac Park = \$200

To Fully-Fund Pontiac Park Improvements = \$1,200
