

HOW TO BE SAVED



"If you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord", and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. Romans 10:9 (See verse 10)

When I am preparing a lesson or sermon with a specific theme, I find it useful to research the word or phrase in a Biblical lexicon. This allows me to better understand the meaning of the word/phrase in the original language (Greek or Hebrew). It also allows me to appear smarter than I actually am. As with our languages, there are often many different words that express a single idea in Greek and Hebrew. This month, the idea we have chosen to highlight is one of the prayer center's cardinal points: 24/7 Praise and Worship. As I am sure you know, both praise and worship are discussed in length in the Old and New Testaments. However, there is no single word that encapsulates everything that praise and worship are. Luckily for us, there are plenty of words to choose from in the Hebrew text. For today, I am only looking at the Hebrew text, so the New Testament will have to wait outside for now. Don't worry: I gave him some money for an ice cream cone. It should be noted that there are more than 7 words for praise in Hebrew, but these are often regarded as the main ones. Let's get started!

7 Hebrew Words of Praise

- 1) <u>Tehillah</u>- "praise"/ "song of praise"/ "The song of the Lord"/ "laudations of the spirit"
- > <u>Psalm 119:171</u>- May my lips overflow with (Tehillah), for you teach me your decrees.
- *Tehillah should not be held back from God.
- > <u>Psalm 33:1</u>- Sing joyfully to the LORD, you righteous; it is fitting for the upright to (Tehillah) Him.
- *Tehillah suits the righteous worshiper well. It is beautiful and proper.
- > <u>Psalm 22:3</u>- But thou art holy, O thou that inhabitest the (Tehillah) of Israel.
- *Tehillah is a covenant bond with God. In this verse, inhabits (in Hebrew) literally means "God will marry Himself to our praise." That should show how serious He is about our praise.

- 2) <u>Zamar</u>- "to make music" (in praise of God)/ "instrumental worship"
- > <u>Psalm 108:1</u>- My heart, O God, is steadfast; I will sing and (Zamar) with all my soul.
- *Musicians and singers alike are to make music in praise of God. It is not enough to just sing or play; it is an act of worship. The sound should come into agreement with the lyrics. Don't just sing the words, sing what the words mean. What does it sound like to be "a lover of Your presence."
- 3) <u>Yadah</u>- "extended hand"/ "to throw, cast"/ "to revere or worship with the hands"
- > <u>Psalm 67:5</u>- May the peoples (Yadah) You, God; may all the peoples (Yadah) You.
- *(Genesis 29:35) The first instance of Yadah in the Old Testament is when Leah gave birth to Judah. As the baby was born, she said, "This time I shall praise the Lord." Yadah is surrendered hands lifted up to God in reverence. It is exalting the Lord and raising Him up because no height is too great for Him.
- 4) Barak- "to kneel"/ "to bow down"/ "to bless"
- > Genesis 24:48- Then I bowed my head and worshiped the Lord and (Barak) the Lord, the God of my master Abraham, who had led me by the right way...
- *Barak is often associated with blessing. You bow down or kneel to give thanks for a blessing or in expectation of a blessing. It can also be an act of adoration or salutation.
- 5) <u>Towdah</u>- "a confession of praise and thanksgiving"/ "a sacrifice of praise"
- > Psalm 50:14- Offer to God a (Towdah), and perform your vows to the Most High.
- *Towdah comes from the same principle root word as Yadah. In Psalms, Towdah is used for thanking God for things not yet received as well as things already in hand. Interestingly enough, the title for Psalm 100 is Towdah (A Psalm of Thanksgiving)...(Continued on pg.9)
