## MILESTONES

- Tyler Currier is skating in his 100<sup>th</sup> career ECHL game today. In his ECHL career, he has appeared with the Alaska Aces, Missouri Mavericks and Elmira Jackals, totaling 38 points (23 goals, 15 assists) and 146 penalty minutes. He also skated in 35 CHL games with Missouri before they joined the ECHL bringing his professional total to 47 points in 134 games.

## MAGNIFYING THE MATCHUP

The Jackals head back out on the road for a Sunday afternoon affair against the Manchester Monarchs. Elmira opened its season-long six-game road stretch in New Hampshire with a weekend split against the East Division leading Monarchs. In the last meeting, Allan McPherson recorded his first career hat trick in a four-point effort leading the Jackals past Manchester on Super Bowl Sunday, 5-4. The line of McPherson, Cason Hohmann and Chris Langkow was responsible for all five Jackals' goals en route to the victory. Chris Langkow recorded a goal and two assists and Cason Hohmann posted a goal and an assist to extend his point streak to nine games. Alex Vazzano made 34 saves and earned his first career ECHL win. Elmira is 2-1-0 at Verizon Wireless Arena this season and is 3-4-0 against Manchester, which joined the ECHL this offseason. Allan McPherson leads the Jackals against the Monarchs with five goals and six points.

- C.J. Motte leads all rookie goaltenders and ranks third overall with 976 saves. He also leads all first-year netminders and ranks fifth overall with 2035 minutes played.

- Elmira is 14-3-2 when scoring first.

- Cason Hohmann is tied for fifth among rookies with 16 goals and ranks eighth with 37 points.

- Jacob MacDonald leads the league with four shorthanded goals.

- The Jackals are 18-0-2 when leading after two.

- Elmira is 16-3-4 in one-goal games.
