MILESTONES

- Tyler Currier is nearing 100 career ECHL games. Tonight, he is skating in his 99th ECHL contest. Including his 35 games in the CHL, Currier will be appearing in his 134th professional game.

- Nick Tuzzolino is skating in his 550th professional game tonight. He has skated in 356 ECHL games, 111 in the AHL, and 82 combined between the IHL and UHL.

MAGNIFYING THE MATCHUP

Tonight, the Jackals host their in-state rival from Glens Falls. This meeting marks the seventh of 11 overall this season and the fourth of six at First Arena. Elmira exploded for eight goals last Tuesday in Glens Falls, tying a season-high for goals scored in a single game and setting a new mark for their winning margin. Eleven different Jackals registered at least one point including multi-point games for Chris Langkow, Allan McPherson, Tyler Currier, Zach Cohen, Jacob MacDonald, and Justin Bernhardt, while C.J. Motte turned aside all 28 Thunder shots to earn his second shutout of the season. The Jackals' shutout win was the second straight shutout in the season series, however, the Thunder were victorious in the previous meeting, 1-0. Kent Simpson out-duelled Alex Vazzano in a goaltending exhibition as the Thunder were in the midst of an ECHL record-setting shutout streak. The Jackals are 3-3-0 against the Thunder since they joined the ECHL prior to the start of this season.

FAST FACTS

- C.J. Motte leads all rookie goaltenders and ranks third overall with 913 saves. He also ranks second among rookie netminders and sixth overall with 1913 minutes played.

- Tyler Currier leads the Jackals with four game-winning goals.

- The Jackals are 18-0-2 when leading after two.

- Cason Hohmann ranks seventh among rookies with 37 points (16 goals, 21 assists). He is tied for third among rookies in goals.

- Elmira is 15-3-4 in one-goal games.
