Black & White Digital Photography

The Arc of Greater Plymouth's Life Skills Photography class will be focusing this session on Black and White photography. We will be exploring different nature settings and capturing shots in black and white.

Week 1— Worlds End in Hingham

Rolling hills and rocky shorelines offer sweeping views of the Boston skyline, while tree-lined carriage paths designed by famed landscape architect Frederick Law Olmsted make delightful walking trails.

Week 2— North River Wildlife Sanctuary in Marshfield

Sensory trail. On this trail you can listen to songbirds and chipmunks, visit a wetland and learn about animals that make North River their home.

Week 3— Aptuxet Trading Post in Bourne

The structure existing today is a replica erected on the original foundation which was archaeologically excavated in the 1920's, and is surrounded by 12 acres of recreational land and gardens.

Week 4— Attleboro Springs Reflection Trail in Attleboro

A nature trail for all seasons, all senses and all people.
