A Missional Model

As a church we understand that living out a missional life is very daunting and often times a mystery for many of us. Although systems and models could never be a substitute for a life on mission we feel very strongly that both can be used as tools to inspire, teach and develop the confidence within our church family to live out Christ's call within the day to day lives of every individual. Our goal is to adopt a model on Wednesday Nights which will allow people the opportunity to engage in a multifaceted missional setting that provides a safe, orderly environment for learning and engagement. Every week provides the organizational structure, resources and vision for each person within our community to learn what it means to fulfill the BELLS challenge. Fulfilling the basic principles of what it means to live a Gospel centered life within the spheres of influence in our lives.

We learn by doing. This is a principle that exists in every arena of our lives; from the dinner table to the workplace. But for some reason this often fails to translate into the missional arena of our Church experience. It is so easy to listen to sermons and teachings which exposit the missional mandate of the Gospel and leave us feeling moved and passionate only to "lose steam" when faced with the stark reality of not knowing the "how" behind the "call". We believe that the acrostic BELLS lays out a very easy and practical format which serves as a natural "onramp" leading us towards missional living as a part of The Body of Christ.

Eat Missionally (One meal a week used to engage a family missionally)

Listen to the Spirit (20 min. of daily Quiet Time w/ God)

Learn Jesus (20 min. of daily Learning Time w/ God)

Sent Identity (Living on purpose 1 Day at a time following Jesus)
