EDUCATIONAL NEEDS ASSESSMENT:

Concussions are more common, and the consequences of concussion are more serious than previously understood. Increasing evidence demonstrates long-term issues after repeated concussions. More importantly, recent legislation (AB 2127) mandates a graduated Return-To-Play protocol of no less than seven days, which must be supervised - *and signed off* - by a physician.

This course will provide a comprehensive update on state-of-the-art practices in a variety of essential areas. Ample time will be allotted for audience participation through question-and-answer sessions.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

Participants should be able to:

- 1) correctly diagnose, manage and treat acute concussion,
- 2) manage simple concussions at the level of primary care,
