The Governor shall seek individuals who have had personal or

Qualifications:

Governor: (Welf. & Inst. Code § 5845(a)(5).)

Two (2) persons with a severe mental illness

 One (1) family member of an adult or senior with a severe mental illness

 One (1) family member of a child who has or has had a severe mental illness

One (1) physician specializing in alcohol and drug treatment

One (1) mental health professional

One (1) county sheriff

One (1) superintendent of a school district

One (1) representative of a labor organization

 One (1) representative of an employer with more than 500 employees

• One (1) representative of an employer with less than 500 employees

One (1) representative of a health serves plan or insurer

Attorney General or his or her designee. (Welf. & Inst. Code § 5845(a)(1).)

Qualifications: (continued)

President pro Tempore of the Senate selects the Chairperson of the Senate Health and Human Services Committee or another member of the Senate. (Welf. & Inst. Code § 5845(a)(3).)

<u>Speaker of the Assembly</u> selects the Chairperson of the Assembly Health Committee or another member of the Assembly.

(Welf. & Inst. Code § 5845(a)(4).)

Term:

Three (3) years, ending on January 1. Terms are staggered so that approximately one-third (1/3) of the appointments expire each year. (Welf. & Inst. Code § 5845(c).)

Grace Period:

Continues to serve until successor has qualified. (Gov. Code §1302.)

Compensation:

None, except for actual and necessary expenses.

(Welf. & Inst. Code § 5845(b).)

Meeting

Frequency:

Meet at least once each quarter at any time and location

convenient to the public as it may deem appropriate. All meetings

of the commission shall be open to the public.

(Welf. & Inst. Code § 5845(d)(1).)

Bond:

Not stated in statute.

Oath:

Government Code §§ 1360 – 1363

Duties:

Provide technical assistance to any county mental health plan as needed to address concerns or recommendations of the

commission or when local programs could benefit from technical

assistance for improvement of their plans.

(Welf. & Inst. Code § 5846(b).)

Ensure that the perspective and participation of diverse community members reflective of California populations and others suffering from severe mental illness and their family members is a significant factor in all of its decisions and recommendations.

(Welf. & Inst. Code § 5846(c).)

Develop strategies to overcome stigma and discrimination, and accomplish all other objectives and the other provisions of the act establishing the commission. (Welf. & Inst. Code § 5845(d)(8).)

At any time, advise the Governor or the Legislature regarding actions the state may take to improve care and services for people with mental illness. (Welf. & Inst. Code § 5845(d)(9).)

Duties: (continued) If the commission identifies a critical issue related to the

performance of a county mental health program, it may refer the issue to the State Department of Mental Health pursuant to Section
