

Reducing Summer Learning Loss Tips for Businesses and Civic Leaders

- Organize a book drive to collect new and used books, and help get them into the hands of your community's children.
- Organize volunteers to work as tutors, reading partners, and mentors at libraries and other summer learning programs.
- Create a summer passport program that encourages families to visit libraries, museums, zoos, farms, and other community organizations where children can learn by doing. Provide funding for free or discounted admission and transportation.
- ❖ Help organize a summer kick-off event or fair in the early spring to provide families with information about summer programs and opportunities to sign up for these programs.
- ❖ Write an op-ed for your local newspaper describing why keeping children learning, safe, and healthy is important to your state and community.
- Use social media to raise awareness about summer learning loss and strategies for keeping children learning all summer long.
- Organize a summer learning steering committee in your community to look at how to expand access to high-quality summer learning opportunities, or participate on a committee on the state level.
- Provide funding to support summer learning programs in your state and community.
- Advocate for increased, dedicated state and local funding to support summer learning programs in your state and community.
