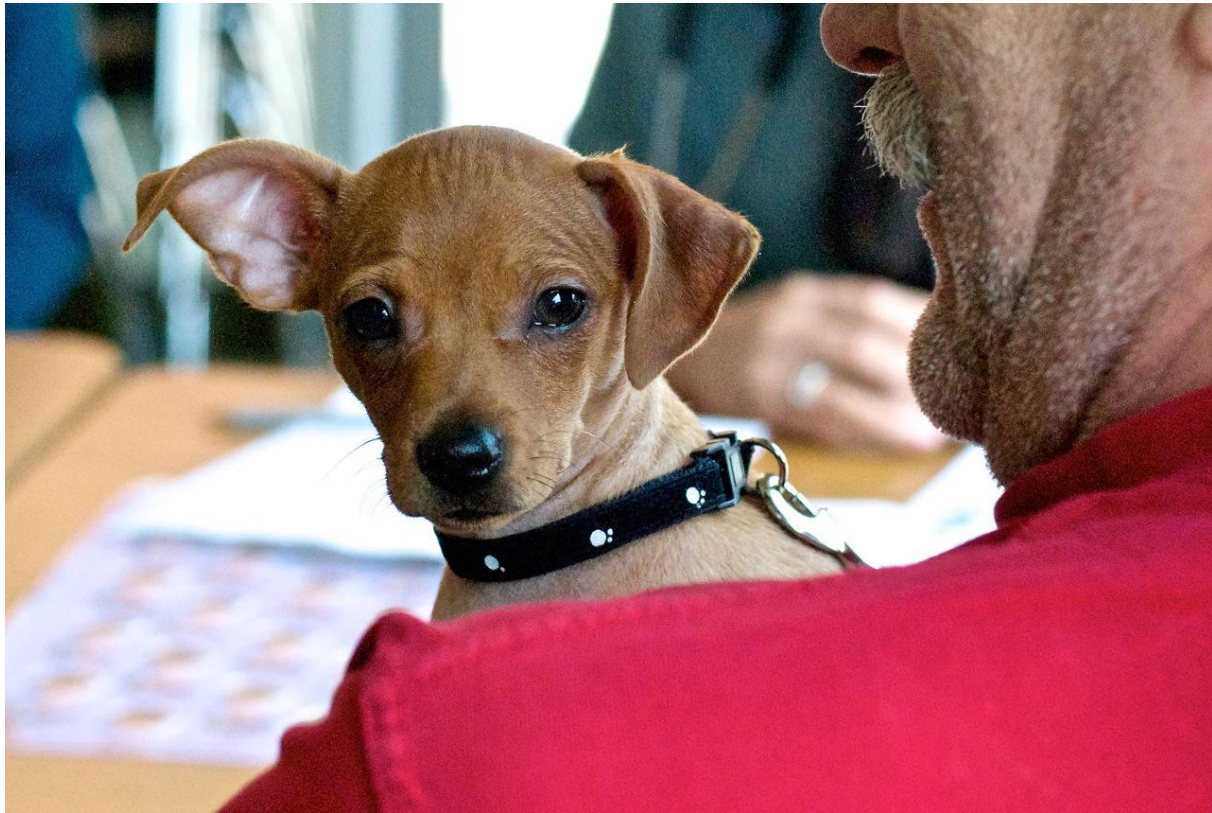


Mini Vet School – ‘Bite Size’ Lecture Series Brings Vets into the Community



A success in Ottawa for the past six years, Mini-Vet School offers the general public a rare opportunity to hear experts discuss all aspects of animal health, including new and exciting advances in the veterinary medical field.

What are the strangest things vets have seen pets eat? What are the most common toxins that bring pets to the ICU? Did you know that there are rehabilitation and physical therapy services available for dogs? How can you help your pet live their longest, healthiest life?

These and other topics will be discussed in depth at the Mini-Vet School during a four part series held every Tuesday in June at Purina PawsWay on Toronto's waterfront. Each evening will feature two one-hour talks as well as a chance to have your most pressing questions answered..

The series is hosted by [Community Veterinary Outreach](http://www.vetoutreach.org), a registered charity that provides free preventative veterinary care for marginalized pet owners who are homeless and/or vulnerably housed.
