ACA/NE Committee Descriptions

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Members of the ACA/NE Board of Directors are responsible for ensuring that the association stays on track in meeting the organization's mission, services, policies and programs.

Board members have a fiduciary responsibility to review and approve the association's budget and financial strategy. They approve major policies, serve on committees or task forces, take on special assignments and promote the association to others in the HVAC industry.

PROGRAMMING

The Programming Committee identifies topics and speakers for ACA/NE's quarterly dinner meetings.

They work to create themes, goals and the focus for the dinner meetings to make the events a better experience for all. They work to foster networking, relationship-building, learning, and a forum that benefits the attendees. The Committee also develops educational forums designed to provide technical and professional development for HVAC employers and employees.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

To build a skilled workforce to meet future demands and offset a potential labor shortage in the HVAC industry, the ACA/NE Workforce Development Committee works to develop programs and models to provide employees with the capability to install and service HVAC equipment in compliance with local, state and federal laws.

They also work to identify current trade apprenticeship and general education programs and develop recommendations for education tracks and course content.

MEMBERSHIP

The Membership Committee is focused on the growth of the ACA/NE membership and maintaining a strong renewal rate for existing members. The Committee:

- Set goals and develop a recruitment program/plan;
- Solicits memberships through relationships. Reaches out to prospective members as needed.
- Acts as ambassador for AC/NE. Involves other members in member growth.

GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS

The Government Affairs Committee monitors and takes action as needed relative to issues of a legislative and/or regulatory nature in the six New England states.

- Committee members take an advocacy role in communicating and promoting the best interests of the industry.
- They represent ACA/NE at public hearings, and meetings with public officials.
- They monitor the activities and provide input to state regulators and legislators.

GOLF TOURNAMENT

The Golf Committee organizes this popular annual event that serves as a strong social-networking forum. The Committee members support the efforts to sell sponsorships and player spots in the tournament to assure a well-rounded mix of suppliers and contractors.
