Our goal was to demonstrate the wide processing capabilities of our products, which satisfied the customer because it gave him options. What we also demonstrated was that all masks are not going to expose the same using conventional and DI exposure units. Steve and I were quite sure of the outcome using different exposure systems, but it was very important for our customer to see and understand the results. In the end, it was a successful visit and we met many very friendly people.
