### OVERVIEW

The purpose of this webinar is to increase participants' knowledge around working with youth who have been sexually abused. Participants will gain a broader understanding of the impact that sexual abuse has during both adolescence and adulthood, which will help inform their work and interactions with sexual abuse victims.

### TOPICS

- Describe warning signs of youth being sexually abused.
- Discuss the social, psychological, and physical effects of sexual abuse.
- Explain strategies on how to be trauma-informed and trauma-sensitive while providing sexual health education and services to sexually abused youth.

### PRESENTER

He has been in private practice since January 2012, as well as serving as an Adjunct Faculty at Indiana University School of Social Work since 2003, and Marian University since 2012.
