The activities for our Middle school will include:

We encourage all of our students to come in a costume. Purim costumes need not be limited to the Purim figures; they can be homemade and should be as creative as possible. Roller blades, skateboards, and any like sporting gear will not be permitted for safety reasons.

We will be giving ready-to-eat gifts to our friends called **Mishloach Manot** and will be preparing them in our classrooms. This year as a campaign against (BDS – Boycott Divest and Sanctions) we will be preparing a special "Klee" (vessel or dish) that can be displayed in a prominent place in your home and/or office, that should be filled with **Israeli products only**. Please send in Israeli products with your child/children, one treat that will be enough for each child in the classroom.
