COLLEGE OF WILLIAM AND MARY PRE- COLLEGIATE SUMMER PROGRAM IN EARLY AMERICAN HISTORY

AMERICAN HISTORY FROM THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION THROUGH THE CIVIL WAR

Presented in partnership with the National Institute of American History and Democracy, this college credit program will allow students to attend lectures, seminars and discussions in early American history. The course will also provide active, hands-on examination and discovery of historical sites relating to each topic. Students will be participating in archaeological digs and critical thinking and writing opportunities. This program will help examine different themes, similarities and contradictions relating to the field and study of American History as a basis for the development and growth of our country's Union.

SOLID ROCKET MOTOR DESIGN CLASS AT CP TECHNOLOGIES

This prestigious course will lead students through the design and then fabrication and testing of solid rocket motors. The four-day intensive program takes place at the CP Technologies rocket propulsion company in Casper, Wyoming. During the course, students will design motors incorporating thrust, chamber pressure, duration, etc.

NATIONAL STUDENT LEADERSHIP PROGRAM IN BUSINESS AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP AT UCLA

Ashley will experience realistic simulations to start, manage and build a company and will meet with and learn from leaders in the business world. Dana will attend a pluralistic study abroad program for six weeks at Alexander Muss High School in Israel, where Israeli and Jewish history courses will be taught throughout Israel using the land as the classroom.

YOUNG ENTREPRENEUR FOR LEADERSHIP AND SUSTAINABILITY (YELS) AT THE UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA

Mikaela will take two college-level courses and complete at least 60 hours of community service with organizations such as the Alachua Conservation Trust, Citizens Co-op/Cooperative Communities, the Early Learning Coalition, Wilmot Gardens at Shands Hospital, the Community Weatherization Coalition/EarthGivers, Forage Farm, Florida Organic Growers - GIFT Community Garden planting, Current Problems/Adopt-a-River, and the Repurpose Project. She will also participate in evening programs, including a Speaker Series (featuring notable leaders in the fields of entrepreneurship and social entrepreneurship), a mentor program (where students are paired with both undergraduate students pursuing a minor in entrepreneurship or organizational leadership for nonprofits, and adult entrepreneurs and social entrepreneurs), the New Heroes Film Series, visits to an Entrepreneurship Incubator, and many others.

GLOBAL YOUTH SUMMIT ON THE FUTURE OF MEDICINE, BRANDEIS UNIVERSITY

Josh will participate in this transformative program, which will focus on the future of the healthcare industry, as well as develop leadership, networking and collaborative skills necessary to be a leader in the field. NEW YORK FILM ACADEMY
AT HARVARD

Harvard University, founded 16 years after the arrival of the Pilgrims at Plymouth Rock, celebrated its 350th anniversary in 1986. Six presidents of the United States—including John Quincy Adams, Franklin Delano Roosevelt and John Fitzgerald Kennedy—graduated from Harvard. Its faculty have produced more than 30 Pulitzer Prize winners and 30 Nobel Laureates.



Harvard is the setting for the extremely intensive workshops of the NYFA. Robbie will live and breathe his work of creating and developing all aspects of a short film. He will also enjoy the activities and events being held in and around Harvard Yard during the summer, and the enormous variety of museums in the area. These include Harvard’s Fogg Art Museum, and the Ware Collection of Glass Flowers at the Harvard Museum of Natural History.

ABRAHAM WASERSTEIN

BRONFMAN YOUTH
FELLOWSHIP, ISRAEL
AND BOYS STATE PROGRAM

Abe is one of 26 teens selected nationally for the prestigious yearlong Bronfman Youth Fellowship, which is focused on identifying the future leaders of the Jewish people in the Diaspora and in Israel. Within the Jewish teen world, this is considered among the most prestigious fellowships around. Abe will be part of an all-expense paid program for five weeks in Israel this summer, two seminars during the upcoming year, and lifelong connections with young people and alumni who make significant contributions to the Jewish and secular community.



Fellows engage in thought provoking study and conversation and make lifelong friends. The high-caliber educators focus on teaching a broad range of traditional and contemporary Jewish texts at a university level. Fellows encounter the land and people of Israel, study major issues in contemporary Jewish life, meet with some of today’s most influential figures, and learn about themselves and each other. The Fellowship year continues with seminars in December and March in New York. Participants continue their association with the Fellowship through our extraordinarily active, 1000-plus alumni community.

Abe was also chosen to represent **American Legion Post 277 in the Boys State program for the State of Florida.** Boys State is among the most respected and selective educational programs of government instruction for U.S. High School students. At Boys State, participants learn the rights, privileges and responsibilities of franchised citizens. The training is objective and centers on the structure of city, county and state governments operated by students elected to various offices. Instruction will also be presented on the law and court system, parliamentary procedure and Florida political History. Participants will gain hands-on experience in leadership by taking part in the political process through role-play civic exercises in Tallahassee.

USY ISRAEL PILGRIMAGE,
ISRAEL ADVENTURE

Hannah will join about 30 Jewish High School students who are involved with USY (United Synagogue Youth) internationally on this four-week intensive program. Through immersion, she will learn about Israel’s history and Jewish practices while experiencing Israel in a unique and interesting way. Participants will develop a new love for the Jewish homeland. Highlights of the program include travel to and activities within Jerusalem’s Old City, Mount Herzl, Masada and Ein Gedi; kayaking on the Jordan River; visiting Tzfat; snorkeling in the Red Sea; experiencing the Dead Sea; and visiting several Kibbutzim.



CLAIRE AND EMANUEL G. ROSENBLATT
HIGH SCHOOL AT DKJA

Students at Claire and Emanuel G. Rosenblatt High School at DKJA have the opportunity to excel in a broad selection of AP classes as well as Honors classes in virtually all curriculum areas. Its program provides a diverse range of offerings that focus on rigorous academics and social and emotional aspects of learning. The primary goal of the curriculum is to develop the students’ academic intelligence, strength of character and Jewish identity, preparing them for the challenges of higher education in particular, and life in general. Students participate on the March of the Living during their senior year, followed by a trip to Israel.

In addition, the College Guidance program begins in ninth grade to comprehensively guide students through individualized academic course selection throughout their High School years. Students are encouraged to explore their own talents, strengths and interests while considering the many possible educational opportunities available after graduation, and they are guided to explore summer and co-curricular opportunities that will enhance both their High School experience and college application profile.

STUDENT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Graduates of Rosenblatt High School have earned all levels of AP Scholar designation by the College Board for their exceptional achievement on the college-level AP Exams. Recognition and awards from the National Merit® Scholarship Program, an academic competition based on the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test, have proudly been earned by Rosenblatt High School students.
