More details on the Rukamiro Self-Sustainment and Income Generation Projects:

FPC Huntsville helped finish construction on the Rukamiro Sanctuary in 2014 and attended the church dedication ceremony in October 2014. Since then – and partially due to the completion and availability of the church – Rukamiro has received a new water well (from the government) and solar panels/electricity (from the Presbyterian Church of Rwanda).

Rukamiro would like to further leverage their new sanctuary and gifts of water and electricity to provide education, jobs, income, and self-sustainability opportunities to the residents of the region. These programs will serve not only the church members but will also be an outreach and witness to the unchurched in the area.

Adult Literacy Program – Initial cost \$1200. Cost includes books, pens, pencils, blackboards, chalk, nominal teacher's salaries and transportation costs. Classes will be conducted in the new church. They will last 6 months and will start with 40 students – 20 men and 20 women. There is a very great need for adult literacy programs, and it is estimated that over 300 adult students will be served over a three-year period.

Hair Salon – Total cost \$1500. Cost includes haircutting supplies, mirrors, chairs, towels, generator, and shelving. There are already trained hair stylists who have a building, and now they also have water and electricity. The salon will be self-sustaining: income will pay salaries and supply fees. It will benefit everyone in the region, as there is no salon nearby.

Grinding Machine – Total cost \$5000. Cost includes grinding machine, building of a small house for machine, transportation of machine, and installation. Machine will grind both corn and sorghum (another staple grain) and will benefit over 1000 people in the region, who must now walk several miles each way to get their grain ground.
