Whether it's tackling that next speech in your Competent Communicator or an Advanced manual, taking on a role at a meeting that you've never done before, or even signing up to be a contestant in a Club contest – it's by doing these things that we gain the skills and confidence to overcome our fears.

There are plenty of places in our life where we can take a risk, not knowing what the outcome will be. But in Toastmasters one thing is guaranteed . . . you will always receive positive and constructive feedback from your peers no matter what risk you take. If any of the ideas mentioned above feels like a big risk to you, then start small, pick one thing you've never done before and slowly build from there. Trust us — you'll live to speak another day and your fear of public speaking will slowly melt away . . . just like the snow outside our windows is doing at this very moment.

TIP OF THE MONTH

We've all been there ... You're in the middle of a speech and you make a mistake. What do you do now? If you're in the middle of your speech and something goes wrong, don't freeze and don't apologize; tell a joke instead! By telling a quick joke, it will not only put you at ease but it will put the listeners at ease. Humor has many benefits for speakers:

- It helps establish a bond with the audience
- It can win over a hostile audience
- Humor keeps the audience interested
- Humor helps emphasize or illustrate a point
- It helps people remember you
