Christmas for the Gentiles

"And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness:

God was manifested in the flesh, Justified in the Spirit, Seen by angels, Preached among the Gentiles, Believed on in the world, Received up in glory" (1 Tim. 3:16).

The baby Jesus invited the magi from the east to kneel down and worship Him in His home (Matt. 2:1-12). And Jesus' family kept growing with the addition of more Gentiles. The centurion with the paralyzed servant knew he was un-
