# VARINA HOWELL PLAQUE

**Location:** West Wall of the Church

**Installation Date:** Unknown

**Description:** Bronze Memorial Tablet- Architectonic form with shaped pediment, having stylized anthemion and trialing acanthus. The frieze centering a stars and bars shield with flanking waterleaf foliage and rosettes. Fluted Ionic pilaster. Plinth base. Acanthus corbel supports.

### Plaque Text:

To the Glory of God and in memory of Varina Banks Howell
wife of Jefferson Davis only president of the Confederate States of America
Born May 7, 1826 + Died Oct 16, 1906. Where thou diest, will I die. And there
will I be buried. The Lord do so to me and more also if ought but death part
thee and me.





# VARINA ANNE DAVIS PLAQUE

**Location:** West Wall of the Church

**Installation Date:** 1899

**Description:** Bronze Memorial Tablet- Architectonic form with arched egg-and-mold frieze, stop-fluted pilasters with stars and bars plinths flanking a profile portrait bust in laurel wreath crested by a cross. Plinth base with coat of arms on each side. Attached to a marble slab, rosette bolt covers.

### Plaque Text:

The daughter of the Confederacy Varina Anne Davis born July 27 1864, entered into eternal life September 18 1898 blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God.

#### Additional information:

Varina Anne Davis was the daughter of Jefferson Davis.





# JEFFERSON DAVIS PLAQUE

**Location:** West Wall of the Church

**Installation Date:** 1898

**Description:** Brass memorial Tablet- Architectonic form with broken triangular pediment having rosette terminals and centering an urn finial. Three Confederate flags fronted by a round seal of the Confederacy, which reads "THE CONDEDERATE STATES OF AMERICA – 22 February 1862 –DEO VINDICE".

### Plaque Text:

To the glory of God and in Memory of

Jefferson Davis President of the Confederate States of America

Born June 3 1808

Died December 6 1889

#### Additional information:

The ribbons on the columns include the names of each state that belonged to the Confederate States of America.



### FREDERIC ROBERT SCOTT PLAQUE

**Location:** West Wall of the Church

**Installation Date:** 1903

**Description:** Bronze memorial tablet- Polished outer border of chained olive leaves. Palm and banner centered at the top of the textured and patina ground. Mounted in a molded gilt frame.

### Plaque Text:

In 1903

The adjoining robing and infant class rooms are erected in loving memory of our father Frederic Robert Scott

Who, though born in Ballyshannon, Ireland espoused the cause of the south in the war between the states, bearing arms and serving as private in the Petersburg rifles and later as major attached to the staff of General Robert E. Lee, and surrendered at Appomattox

Born October 22, 1830 - Died at Richmond, Virginia May 15, 1898 Member of this church for 26 years



# ROBERT LEE PLAQUE

**Location:** East Wall of the Church

Installation Date: unknown

**Description:** Oak and brass memorial plaque. Rectangular oak back with foliate-carved corners. Applied brass shield with Lee Family crest in upper left corner, Confederate flag in upper right corner and a central red cross.

# Plaque Text:

To the Glory of God and in grateful memory of Robert Edwd [sic] Lee

Commander of the Army of Northern Virginia

and Christs Faithful soldier and servant into his life's end.



# **KNEELERS**

**Location:** Altar of the Church

Creation Date: Unknown

**Description:** Pair of needlepoint covered wooden kneelers, rectangular. Red field with gold center cross. Bordered edge with stylized acanthus leafage. Worn.
