From Clubhouse Dining

Greetings to all! Welcome to summer, finally as we see these hot days creeping in. After a pretty blah spring I am looking forward to the summer months. One of my favorite things to do in the summer is check out local produce. I love coming off the beach and stopping at the Veggie Wagon in Carolina Beach, or one of the many road side stands on the way back to Wilmington. I prefer to get all my produce this way when I can.



I am going to take a different route this month, and offer up one of my favorite recipes. This is a dish that has been somewhat of a signature dish that I am requested to bring to parties all the time. It is a black bean salsa recipe that I came up with while living on Nantucket.

The inspiration started with a local farms incredible corn. Nantucket's Bartlett's Farm has produced some of the best corn and tomatoes that I have ever tasted. They have many years of experience bringing all types of fresh produce to the island, and are a landmark on the cobble stoned Main Street for their vegetable and flower stands. Family run and Family owned till this day.

So here is the recipe, I recommend using the best ingredients possible, but if you don't have time to cook your own black beans, don't skimp! Spend the extra money for a quality black bean (Progresso or Goya). An inferior product will not have the same texture and consistency (mushy beans). My black bean salsa is a great topping for grilled fish or chicken as well as enjoyed with tortillas. Let me know if you like the recipe. I prefer blue corn tortilla chips, but that is up to you! Crack open a cold one and get to work!

Main Ingredients:

2 lbs of cooked black beans (or 2 cans of good black beans drained)

4 ears of local shoe peg (white corn) lightly blanched and removed from the cob or a can of Mitchell's shoe peg corn drained

- 1 large red bell pepper cut in to a ¼ inch dice
- 1 large orange pepper cut in to a ¼ inch dice
- 2 medium jalapeños cut in to a 1/8 inch dice
- 1 medium sized red onion cut in a ¼ inch dice
- 1 bunch of green onions cut in to 1/8 inch dice on the bias
- 1 bunch of cilantro chopped very fine

Dressing:

1/4 cup each of 2 of the following juices (total of ½ cup)
Fresh lime and sweet orange or fresh grapefruit
3 table spoons of EVO

1 teaspoon of cumin powder

1 teaspoon of chili powder

Salt & pepper to taste



Whenever I prepare this dish, I try to put the dressing together first so that the flavors can meld. Otherwise it is as simple as chopping the ingredients and putting everything together. Enjoy!


