Day 1 Miami Arrive in Miami and transfer to the Miami Airport Hilton on your own. Today in the hotel lobby meet your Central Holidays Representative who will hold a mandatory Cuba orientation meeting where you will receive your final Cuba documentation.

Day 2 Miami – Santa Clara – Cayo Santa Maria, Cuba This morning transfer via private coach to the airport for your flight to Cuba. Departure times will be listed at the Hospitality Desk in the hotel lobby. Upon arrival at Miami International Airport check in for your flight. Upon arrival in Santa Clara, Cuba and after clearing customs at the airport, we'll meet our local Cuban tour guide, an experienced bilingual guide outside the terminal. We will depart for Cayo Santa Maria to check into the Sol Cayo Santa Maria Hotel & Resort for our two night stay. Cayo Santa Maria is surrounded by crystal blue Caribbean waters featuring a rugged interior and has been declared a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve. Enjoy dinner this evening at the hotel. (D)

Day 3 Cayo Santa Maria - Caibarien - Remedios - Cayo Santa Maria This morning depart for Caibarien, known as "La Villa Blanca" (The White Town), for an overview of this seaside town before visiting the Printing Museum. Next, enjoy a concert by locals of Caibarien and a chance to interact with them in the town square. Then it's off to the Marcello Salado Sugar Mill Museum. In 2002 the government activated a plan for the reconversion of Cuba's sugar mills. The Ministry of Sugar decided that, of the 156 mills that existed at that time, which five would be converted into museums. Today we visit a shining example of Cuba's sugar industry. Upon arrival enjoy a sugar cane drink before a guided tour of the amazing machines that are used to process sugar cane. Later we take a short Steam Train Ride from the museum to a local restaurant for lunch. After lunch we head to the colonial jewel town of Remedios, founded by the Spanish in 1578. Enjoy a Remedios Walking Tour with a local historian/guide. See the Central Plaza, or "Plaza Mayor", that is surrounded by colonial buildings, beautiful monuments, trees, palms and a gazebo like many towns in Cuba. Next, tour inside the colonial grand church "Iglesia Mayor" of San Juan Bautista containing beautifully decorated gold altars. Afterwards we stroll through the main shopping street to learn the differences between Ration, Cuban Pesos and CUC stores. Explore the complexity of the two-currency system and have the opportunity to talk with Cubans and workers who shop at these stores. Tonight, it's time to dust off your dancing shoes and learn to dance the Salsa with the locals. Enjoy dinner this evening at the hotel. (B,L,D)

Day 4 Cayo Santa Maria - Santa Clara - Havana Following breakfast we'll leave Cayo Santa Maria behind and depart for Havana. Along the way we will stop in Santa Clara, a city most famous because of the history of Cuba's revolution and the massive Che Guevara Memorial, a 25 foot-tall bronze statue of Che bearing his rifle, by sculptor José Delarra. Tour the Che Guevara Museum and see the Mausoleum where his remains are laid to rest. Santa Clara was the site of the last battle in the Cuban Revolution in late 1958. There were two guerrilla columns that attacked the city, one led by Che Guevara and the other led by Camilo Cienfuegos. Che's column first captured the garrison at Fomento. Then, using a bulldozer, Guevara's soldiers destroyed railroad tracks and derailed a train full of troops and supplies sent by President Batista. After lunch we will visit a local liberal arts school and interact with its students and teachers. After the school visit, we continue to Havana. Upon arrival you will enjoy a photo stop at Revolution Square, one of the largest public squares in the world. (B,L)

Day 5 Havana After breakfast you will tour the Museum of the Revolution that displays a vast array of documents, weapons, relics and even planes from the revolution. The museum is housed in the former presidential palace that was the home to Cuba's leaders from the 1920s until 1959. Continuing onwards you will have an educational exchange with a local expert who will speak about Havana's unique architecture, the challenges of renovating the city's exquisite historic buildings, and the future of these restorations. Then, you will explore the charming cobblestone streets of Old Havana, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, while participating in an open dialogue with the local expert on architectural topics of interest. Next, visit the Maqueta Vieja Habana Museum that houses the scale model of the City of Havana to see the whole city, and learn about its architecture as well as more about restoration efforts. Following lunch in Old Havana, Heading out of the city you will enter the realm of Ernest Hemingway with a visit to Hemingway's Farm, Finca La Vigia. The house where the Nobel Prize winner lived with his wife Martha for 21 years is situated on this beautiful property overlooking Havana. Tour the perfectly preserved home where many of Hemingway's personal belongings remain today, as well as his wooden yacht "Pilar." On this vessel, Hemingway patrolled for Nazis and it was also featured in his novel "Islands in the Stream." Before dinner, meet a former Cuban baseball player and join in a dialogue regarding the history and the love of this favorite pastime in Cuba. This evening, enjoy your dinner at a local restaurant. (B,L,D)



Day 6 Havana – Viñales – Pinar Del Rio – Havana Today you will venture northwest out of Havana through the Cuban countryside to the UNESCO World Heritage site of the Viñales Valley, located in Cuba's western most mountainous range. This region, situated in the province of Pinar Del Río, is known for its breathtaking scenery. The area is dotted with spectacular limestone mountains (mogotes) rising to a height of up to 300 meters. Here you will gaze upon spectacular caverns and rivers and discover the region's vast tobacco fields, still cultivated today using traditional methods that have survived unchanged for centuries. In Pinar Del Río you will tour the Francisco Donatón Cigar Factory to learn about the manufacturing of fine Cuban cigars and enjoy an educational exchange with workers about the history and process of cigar-making in Cuba. As your day continues, you will visit a traditional tobacco plantation and farmhouse where you will get to know an authentic tobacco farmer. During this enlightening interaction you will learn about tobacco cultivation and the tobacco leaf drying process then experience a cigar rolling demonstration firsthand. Enjoy a visit inside the farmer's home and have a sit-down with his family while sipping on a "cafecito" – a sweetened shot of Cuban-style espresso coffee. This is a superb opportunity to witness up-close how Cuban families live in a rural setting. After this exciting encounter, a stop at Los Jazmines viewpoint offers the ideal photo-op with its awe-inspiring views of Viñales Valley, perfect for panoramic pictures of this splendidly beautiful region. (B,L)

Day 7 Havana - Matanzas - Havana Today's activities begin after breakfast with an introductory exploration of the world of art in Cuba as you delve-into the National Museum of Fine Arts in Havana. Housed in its current location since 1954, the museum boasts an impressive collection of artwork from painters dating back to the earliest colonizers of Cuba. Here you will meet with a Cuban art expert and a local historian for a presentation on the importance of the artistic pieces housed in this spectacular museum. Next along your journey, you will travel through rural Cuba and arrive in Matanzas, known as "the Venice of Cuba" for its many bridges. Enjoy a city tour where your guide will provide insight into the city's rich history. Tour the well-preserved El Museo Farmacéutico, an old French Colonial pharmacy formerly known as Botica La Francesa that was originally founded 1882. It was operational until 1964 when it was transformed into The Museo Farmacéutico. Time has remained still here where many of the items that would have been found in a pharmacy during that time period still line the shelves, such as: hand painted French porcelain vases, more than 500,000 original medical recipe formulas, antique bottles and jars, other seemingly ancient pharmaceutical items. During an illuminating tour you will discover the museum's interesting exhibits and collections including, a prizewinning dispensary table (winner of a bronze medal in the Paris Exposition of 1900), together with tools used for the production of medicines. Next, you will enjoy a brief architectural tour of the famous DuPont Mansion including lunch. Further along you will experience a pottery-making demonstration at the Taller de Cerámica Artística (artistic ceramics workshop) and interact with artists to learn about this art form. A stop is made at Bacunayagua Bridge, the highest bridge in Cuba with an observation area offering excellent views for photos. (B,L)

Day 8 Depart Havana – USA After breakfast, bid "adios" to Cuba and depart for the airport and your return flight to Miami with memories to cherish and share of your Discover Cuba trip to this enchanting country in the Caribbean. (B)



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
