## What is a Ten Commandments Hike?

At each stop, for approximately 15 to 20 minutes, a representative of the place of Worship will discuss one or two of the 10 Commandments; introduce the basic theological tenets of their faith, and point out interesting architectural and historical aspects of their House of Worship .
