SCA Conservation Crews SF Peninsula Summer 2015

The SCA Conservation Crew is a five-week conservation service-learning experience. Participants will receive a stipend for completing the program. The crew will consist of 8-10 crew members, ages 16-19, and two adult leaders. As a team, the crew will perform trail maintenance and site restoration projects in San Mateo County Parks. One day a week, participants will learn about local ecology and ways to preserve the environment. For one weekend during the program the crew will go on a camping trip.

Frequently asked Questions:

Q: What are the requirements to participate in the program?

A: You must be:

- at least 16 years old and no older than 19 years old
- a low-income resident of San Mateo County (eligible for free school lunch program or provide other proof of financial need)
- motivated to do physical work and to learn about protecting the environment
- able to lift and swing tools (shovels, sledgehammers, pick mattocks, rakes, etc.); able to be outside for 8 hours a day in
 most kinds of weather; able to hike 30-60 minutes (2 miles); and bend, squat, & walk on uneven ground
- wearing all-leather work boots (no mesh, cloth, nylon, etc.) during work hours. Hardhats and gloves are provided.

Q: What is the time commitment and stipend compensation?

A: You will work Monday-Thursday, and participate in educational and training activities on Friday (attendance required) —for a total of 30-40 hours/week. Crews run for 4-5 weeks between July and August, exact dates to be determined. You will also be on a camping trip on one weekend but free all other weekends. You can earn a stipend of \$1,200 for completing the program. If you miss more than 3 days you may be dismissed from the program and could forfeit your stipend.

Q: What exactly will I be doing as a crewmember?

A: You will engage in rewarding and valuable physical work outdoors on conservation and restoration projects. The work is physically demanding, but if you are motivated and able to meet the requirements above, you will be able to do it! You will participate in two days of orientation at the beginning of the program, a 2-day camping trip, and a celebration event at the end, which friends and family are welcome to attend. Each week time will also be devoted to learning about the local ecology and environment. This is a unique opportunity to learn about the environment and the county park system, to enjoy the outdoors, to gain job and leadership skills, and to work on a team—while also earning a stipend!

Q: Where do we meet each day and what are the hours?

A: You'll meet your Crew Leaders and van each morning at a convenient meeting location. The leaders will drive you to the work site in San Mateo county parks (approx. half hour ride) and back each day. At the end of the work day you'll be dropped off at the same location.
