## Purpose of the post:

To actively promote and engage people, particularly young people, in the creation and development of a hub of woodland learning and enterprise on Falkland Estate.

#### Overview

The main priority within the first six months will be to establish and host the WoodWorks programme for young people who wish to learn about woodland culture and ways of making a living from the woods. By summer 2016, we expect to have completed work on the old sawmill that will provide the physical space for indoor work and learning. A variety of projects will operate out of the premises, building on and linking with existing training and volunteering work: neighbouring craft tenants; a community woodfuel project; and Fife Council's work with children and young people nearby.

The coordinator's role will be to: develop a dynamic hub of woodland learning and enterprise, in collaboration with those who use the centre and surrounding woods; and to contribute towards the creation of a business model that enables the centre to be sustained and expanded through delivery of courses, contracts and rentals.

By summer 2017, the Coordinator will have facilitated the establishment of this new social enterprise where people learn and practice rural skills, craft activities and environmental work. The centre will provide incubation space for new woodland and craft enterprises as well as a place for hosting: courses and events; environmental community action; training and volunteering opportunities.

#### Main duties and responsibilities:

- 1. Develop and coordinate the WoodWorks project including: recruitment and support of young people (16-24 years); successful delivery of training, events and mentoring; and effective collaboration with partners. <a href="www.woodworks.org.uk">www.woodworks.org.uk</a>
- 2. Engage, host and liaise with a range of stakeholders in developing and making best use of the new facilities in ways that add value to the environment and beneficial connections with other learning/activities taking place on the estate.
- 3. Develop and articulate the purpose and role of the Woodland Centre and cultivate a healthy working culture and good relationships with stakeholders.
- 4. Actively contribute to marketing initiatives, including development of content for the digital hub and all forms of social media
- 5. Co-create a sound business model, assess additional needs for the successful long-term operation of the hub and work with other team members, centre users and delivery partners to secure resources to expand and develop the resource.
- 6. Ensure that each stage of the project is effectively evaluated against planned aims and objectives and all reporting requirements met in a timely manner.
- 7. Ensure participation figures are recorded and prepare case studies as required
- 8. Effectively manage, record and report on project expenditure
