- 1. Community members have until May 29th, 2015 to submit their community proposal form.
- 2. YMCA staff will send an email notifying community members of the status of their proposal (received and under review, under review, declined, or accepted).
- 3. The YMCA will review the proposals and select the proposals that meet our criteria for program launch.
- 4. Once the YMCA has selected the accepted proposals, the YMCA Program Director will connect with the Eckstein Administration Team to ensure the activities do not conflict with Eckstein activities.

**Do you drop your student off at Eckstein in the mornings?** If so, please DRIVE SLOWLY AND WATCH CAREFULLY FOR OTHER STUDENTS when you are dropping off your child! We realize everyone is scrambling to get to school and work on time, but we want to make sure all students are safe. It is NOT SAFE to let your student out of the car in the "No Stopping" zone on the west side of 30th Ave NE and it can cause a dangerous traffic back-up at the corner. The school has received calls from concerned parents and neighbors about speeding drivers and students dashing across the street in front of cars on 30th Ave NE. Please help us keep students safe by dropping your student off either on the east (school side) of 30th, in the far south drop-off lot on 30th or at a safer drop-off spot on a side street a block or two away from the school that is less congested than 30th NE. **Phone Calls from Eckstein:** Parents and Guardians, please remind your students that if they call you from a school phone, it's very important to leave a message (even if the message is just "You don't need to call me back"). All of the 100+ phones in the school show the main office number on Caller ID, so if you receive a phone call from Eckstein, please listen to the message to find out who called BEFORE you call the school back, since the main office staff will not know where to transfer your call based on the number that showed on your Caller ID.
