Activity 3:

"**Absolute location** is the exact spot on the Earth where something is. When describing the **absolute location**, people use specific coordinates, like latitude and longitude." - from Brainpop.com (you can also use addresses)

When describing a **relative location** you explain where something is in relation to something else. St. Dominic Savio CHS is down the street from Shipley's doughnuts (do not use this in your descriptions, create your own example)

Study these directions and be able to explain them to a classmate or one of your teachers.
