I am grateful to Mrs. Janoff, Mrs. Wright, Mrs. Stadulis, and Miss Jermain for giving me the jumpstart to D.i.D. I am grateful to D.i.D. for giving me the opportunity to work for them.

I am successful at my job because my job is important to me. I work hard and follow the rules. I always get to work on time. I like being independent.
