Thus, the Big Buddy Little Buddy program was born

The program consists of 24 eighth and ninth grade Pennfield students who work with the autistic support classrooms on a rotating schedule. The buddies work with students on a variety of skills including social skills, reading, math, self-help skills, and play skills. The students in the autism support program enjoy working with the buddies. This also provides the classroom staff with an opportunity to assess student skills for carryover and generalization.

The autism support students have also thrown several fun parties with their new friends, including a cookie exchange around the holidays. This program will continue through the remainder of the year. It's been a great experience for all and both the autism support students and the middle school buddies have greatly benefited from the program.
