Liberty Common High School Summer English Program: Get on Track and Get Ahead!

Did your student struggle to manage the various, demanding language arts this year: grammar, vocabulary, writing, etc.? Are you worried that waiting until next school year to revisit these areas will only result in a deeper hole at the next level? Is your student going to be new at Liberty next year, and are you worried whether he/she will be ready for the cumulative nature of Liberty's English curriculum—especially the rigorous grammar training? Maybe you just want your child to refine and bolster his/her language skills, guided by close instruction and support. Regardless of your reason, this summer's four week English "booster" is the perfect, economical opportunity. The cost is much less than typical tutoring, the tutor-to-student ratio is small, and the instructor is Mr. Dybzinski, head of Liberty's English department. Regardless of whether your student is ahead or behind, he will set your child up for more English success. Furthermore, he plans to have much fun in the process!

- **The cost is \$125 per student, per session** (which equates to only about 7\$ per hour).
 - **IMPORTANT NOTE:** \$75 of your payment (per session) is non-refundable. This will guarantee that only truly committed families take up roster slots. In previous years, late cancellations left some spots unnecessarily empty.
- **Each session will be limited to 12 students** (most sessions fill up each year, so register early for a spot in your preferred session).
- **Important Note:** Because of high demand and waiting lists in previous years, Mr. Dybzinski is offering three grammar sessions (Sessions One, Two, and Four below). Some students (new or returning to Liberty) find the level of grammatical rigor at Liberty hard to manage. This session will be ideal preparation for the beginning of the year grammar launch in each of the English classes. Session Three (Diverse Skills) will cover four-level grammar, vocabulary memorization and usage, writing structure and style, and thoughtful literary analysis.
- **All sessions will be held at LCHS (in Mr. Dybzinski's room—the Zosima Room).**
- **For this program to be viable, at least six students need to sign up for each session.**

Liberty Common High School Summer Spanish Program

Are you heading towards Spanish 1 and you want to get ahead? Or maybe you are in going into Spanish 2, 3, 4 or AP but don't feel very comfortable with your use of Spanish grammar and vocabulary? Or is it just the conversation and writing you need work on?

The Spanish summer program is the place for you.

In Session 1, we will be going over the most important aspects of Spanish grammar from the proper use of gender and number in a sentence, to verb conjugation in all major tenses. Vocabulary will be an important component that we will develop as well.

In session 2, students' language skills such as listening, reading, writing and speaking in Spanish will be developed in an integrated manner. For instance, students will listen to an audio text in Spanish, they will answer oral questions about it and then, they will write a short response on the main theme of the audio text.

The cost is much less than typical tutoring, the tutor-to-student ratio is small, and the instructor is **Mrs. Deitrick**, Spanish 2, 3, 4 & AP teacher and native speaker of Spanish.

Regardless of whether you are ahead or behind, this intensive Spanish summer program will put you on the right track to become bilingual.

- **The cost is \$150 per student, per session**
- **Sessions are 90 minutes**
- **Sessions are limited to 10 students.** (1st come, 1st serve)

Grammatical points to be covered:

- Articles, Nouns & Adjectives: Gender & Number
- Present tense: Regular & Irregular verbs
- Ser & Estar: Uses & Conjugations
- The Preterit: Regular & Irregular verbs + Uses
- The Imperfect: Uses & Conjugations
- The Future & The Conditional
- Perfect tenses: Present Perfect Indicative, Past Perfect Indicative, Future Perfect, Conditional Perfect
- The Subjunctive: Present & Past, plus Present & Past Perfect Subjunctive

Vocabulary topics to be covered:

- Family & other people
- Adjectives: Used to describing people, things, places & emotional states, etc.
- Prepositions of place & Action verbs
- Pastimes & Sports
- Clothes, Colors, Seasons, Weather, Months of the year & Days of the week
- Food & celebrations
