Five years ago, a parent, **Amy Redstone** had an idea - to have a special event to honor a many times overlooked part of a child's life: Grandparents. It started as an idea, and via an email from a founder and now the upper-school principal, **Bob Schaffer**, a few

parents signed up to help.



The first couple years, Amy chaired the committee and we learned and evolved and improved. When Amy was elected to the Board of Directors, she handed the chairperson position to me. Each year, through trial and error, we have improved and perfected the planning, organization, and execution of this event.

Grandparents Day has evolved into a huge, annual, beloved, anticipated event. It could have never have begun or become the success that it has without one thing: Parent volunteers. Every aspect of this event is managed, planned, organized, set up, and executed by Liberty parent volunteers.

I can't possibly list every name of every parent that has contributed to the success of this event. But what I can explain is that there are so many parents who lend a hand, that the enormous event occurs every Tuesday of the week of Thanksgiving seamlessly and professionally.

Planning-committee parents meet every week from the first week of September up until the event. I would like to thank these parent volunteers for committing to meeting every Friday morning for almost three months to plan and prepare:

Parents come in the night before the event to set up a beautiful dining area to seat nearly 600 grandparents complete with linens, centerpieces, and themed decor. Parents arrive the day before the event with food donations for the grandparents.

Parents arrive at 7:00AM or earlier the day of the event to prep food and for final details like balloons and candle lighting. Parents work the event to clear tables, clean up food service equipment, guide and assist grandparents, and break down the entire dining

area to prepare for the students' lunch hours.

Parents provide treats and decor for nearly 200 grandparents at the upper school...Parents who own local businesses donate their time, skills, equipment, product, and services, like the **Beck family, owners of Paninos Restaurant**, prepare a hot breakfast of biscuits, sausage gravy, scrambled eggs and, fresh fruit for close to 600 grandparents!



I want to personally thank each and every one of you who contribute your time and effort to this event. I also know that my thanks are not only personal, but I know I speak on behalf of Liberty's staff and administration as well. You are integral to the exceptionalism of this event and this school.
