


You do not need a large kiln to execute well designed large works of art! In this class you will learn how to create stunning designs, intricate patterns and interconnecting shapes even when you are limited on kiln space.

Students will make four tile sized pieces to create an 8 X 8 or 4 X 16 fused glass sample. Gloria will cover mounting and installation of your glass as well as sharing her extensive slide collection of installed works to help your creativity exponentially multiply.







When do you use frit, enamel or manufactured glass paint? Students will make samples (to be fired at home) using each material, discuss the pros/cons of each and the technical details of each medium.

Pioneer fuser Michael Dupille has developed the latest rendition in glass mediums. Vitrigel is an easy to use organic material that mixes with water to form a gel like consistency. When you add powdered glass frit the design possibilities are endless! Create parts, textures, lines (and even Michael's unique 'frit sandwich') or use a palette knife for wonderful kiln formed effects. Vitrigel allows transparent powder glass to retains its transparency after firing and eliminates burnout so that bright colors remain bright. Students will explore a variety of processes utilizing this unique material and take a piece home for future firing. Total fun!

Thrive, Survive, or Dive: The Business of Retail Glass Craft in 2015

Business people love to brag that they "work smart, not hard." Anyone who has ever owned a glass craft retail business knows that you have to do both to succeed. Some days, even that seems insufficient.

Karen and Paul Tarlow own and operate Helios Fused Glass Studio, a retail and teaching resource center for glass artists and enthusiasts that opened in in Austin, Texas in 2007, just as the global economy was beginning to fall apart. In 2015, Helios celebrated its 8th birthday in a new location that is more than twice the size of the original studio.

In this talk, Paul will share his views on why he thinks Helios, now an internationally renowned teaching studio, not only survived - but thrived - when other studios were forced to close.

Since opening Helios Fused Glass Studio in 2007, Paul has fired over 25,000 square feet of kiln shelves - all loaded with projects completed by hundreds of different people. When you fire that much glass, you learn a lot about what can go wrong. You also learn how to prevent it.

In this workshop, Paul will take you start-to-finish through the process of diagnosing kiln disasters, following best practices for firing glass, and recognizing and mitigating risk for difficult-to-fire projects.

ABOUT PAUL

Paul began working with glass shortly after the millennium bug failed to cause global apocalypse. Perhaps this second chance was the kick he needed to look beyond corporate PowerPoint slides and profits for personal fulfillment.

In 2008, he abandoned his high-tech career (and high-paying) job at Dell to join his wife Karen full-time at Helios Fused Glass Studio, their highly regarded teaching facility in Austin where he makes his artwork, develops new fusing techniques and classes, and is full-time kilnformed glass instructor.

Please place 2 orders – 1 glass and 1 supply for optimum accuracy.


REMINDER Events are the perfect time to pick up HAZMAT items, as well as heavy items such as lead, solder and kilns!
