



## NEW Requirements - CNE Food Safety Training

To prevent disease and promote a healthy environment, Toronto Public Health (TPH) will be enforcing Toronto by-law 678-2006. There must be at least one certified food handler working in a **supervisory capacity** in each area of a food premises where food is prepared, processed, served, packaged or stored.

**Staff in a Supervisory capacity** must possess on them valid photo ID along with a valid Food Handler Certificate issued by an Ontario Public Health Unit.

**All 2016 CNE Food Handlers**, are required by the CNE to have on them when working a 2016 Food Handler Presentation card or a Food Handler document (see below) **and** button.

Staff can obtain a 2016 CNE Food Handler Presentation card and button by attending, in full, one of the 2016 Food Safety Training Sessions.

Staff are exempt from attending the Food Safety Presentation if they display photo identification at the registration location **and** one of the following Food Handler documents:

- a) valid Food Handler Certificate issued by an Ontario Public Health Unit,
- b) 2015 CNE Food Handler Training Program card, or a
- c) 2016 Food Handler Training Program card or a valid Food Handler Certificate issued by a Canadian Public Health Unit.
