Call Process Progressing

Trinity Lone Oak is in the process of identifying and calling a new principal to fill the vacancy created by Sean Martens accepting the call to serve as the Assistant to the President for Education in the Minnesota South District.

The process has gone very smoothly to date. The initial list of 40 names, all with administrative experience, was sifted to sort out about 15 of what was considered to be the stronger candidates. The Call Committee then narrowed the list to six names for initial interviews. NOTE: One of the six declined to be interviewed.

The intent was to rank these six and then take a much closer look at the top two or three. Two names clearly separated themselves from the rest. Those two people will be asked to come to TLO for a visit where board and staff will have a chance to interact with them.

The two current candidates which the Call Committee is choosing to continue exploring are:

Jeff Boehlke from Watertown, MN. Jeff has 24 years of teaching and administrative experience.

Jim Knoepfel from Fremont, NE. Jim has 28 years teaching and administrative experience.

Much more information will be shared about each of them after their on-site visit and TLO is closer to a Call Meeting.
