HEAD COACHES & ASSISTANT COACHES

Head Coaches - You are in charge of your Zone Athletes at all times. Please delegate tasks or chaperone duties to your Assistant Coach when required.

Wear your accreditation at all times. Security will be checking and may not allow you to enter certain areas or the competition grounds without accreditation.

There are a lot of coaches and not each one can help each athlete. We ask that if your expertise is needed by another team or rider that you help them out as best you can. Personal coaches may be present (if they were registered as a volunteer) however the Head Zone Coach takes precedence during the Summer Games. Some of the zones have a lot of athletes and the coaches who have smaller teams can be a big help for the larger teams. Also, in the barn when the athletes are preparing and grooming their horses, you may find you are needed to help here as well.

Be respectful and supportive especially if you are not the athletes regular coach. Make sure you have a copy of the technical package for summer games and are familiar with the Rules governing the competition. The show office will have a copy for reference. There are some rules that will apply that may not be used regarding tack, equipment and schooling.

We have a veterinarian on call during the competition.
We have a farrier on call during competition.

Athlete medical emergencies: There will be well equipped, well trained emergency medical personnel on-site during the competition.
