Awards Ceremony and Journeys Reading

What is the Awards Ceremony and Journeys Reading?

This annual celebration of Minnesota's adult literacy community includes two parts. You may choose to attend either the Awards Ceremony, OR the Student Readings, OR both. Advanced registration is required.

1. **6:00 pm – Awards Ceremony:** Adult literacy students, volunteers, and community partners receive [awards](#) recognizing their outstanding achievements. The awards are separate from the *Journeys* book.
2. **7:00 pm – Journeys Readings:** Adult Basic Education (ABE) learners share their original stories and poems, many of which are featured in [Journeys: An Anthology of Adult Student Writing](#).

The evening will be followed by a reception at 8:00 pm.

Who will be honored at the awards ceremony?

This spring, ABE staff nominated volunteers, learners and community partners for awards. The ceremony will recognize their accomplishments. The awards are separate from the *Journeys* book.

If I'm an award winner, or one of my volunteers/students is an award winner, what should we do?

Register ASAP to reserve your seats for the Awards Ceremony. Seating is limited and can fill quickly. Indicate the total number of persons in your group, including any family or friends who would like to attend. [Register Here](#)

If I'm a teacher or coordinator and have students that would like to read, what should I do?

Please submit one registration for all of the people (students, volunteers and staff) who will be attending. You can register your entire group at once. Indicate the total number and names of the students who will be reading. [Register Here](#)

Please ensure that all students bring their own copy of the story or poem they plan to read on the night of the event. We encourage readers to rehearse the reading ahead of time. To allow as many people to read as possible, all learners should limit their story or poem to 3 minutes or less.

If I'm a student who wants to read, what should I do?

Talk to your teacher or coordinator to ask if others at your school will be reading, or if there is a group of people from your school who will be attending. If possible, ask your teacher or coordinator to register you. If you will be the only person attending from your school, you can register yourself. [Register Here](#)

Can students read if they haven't been published in *Journeys*?

Any learner enrolled in an adult literacy program is welcome to sign up to read an original story or poem. Readers who are published authors in the *Journeys* book will be given preference if a waiting list develops. Please limit the length of each reading to three minutes. Readers are responsible for bringing their own copy of their story or poem.

When can I sign up?

Now! The sooner you sign up, the better. Seating is limited. The event has filled to capacity in the past, so it's best to register as soon as possible. [Register Here](#)
