THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE The APNC began to receive responses from interested candidates in April and has begun reviewing resumes. We plan to schedule phone call interviews with our top candidates followed by in-person interviews with our best candidates during the month of May and early June. The Session approved budgeting for this new Associate Pastor beginning in October of this year. This is a new position for DCPC. This new role will have two primary responsibilities at DCPC. First, this associate pastor will be a “teacher” and will be responsible for the faith development of all age groups at DCPC. They will provide inspiration, vision and training for paid staff and for all DCPC members that are involved in faith formation. Second, this Pastor will serve as the “Faith Leader” of the DCPC children’s faith formation programs, including the DCPC weekday programs, the Youth faith formation programs, and adult ministries such as Presbyterian Women, various classes and Bible studies. Each of these three programs has a capable director that will continue to run their respective programs, but will report to the Associate Pastor. This will allow all staff and members involved in faith formation to work together under the guidance and direction of the Associate Pastor. This will lessen the management responsibilities on the Senior Pastor position, allowing for more time for pastoral care and other ministerial duties. Rabbi Barbara Shulamit Thiede, who has delighted the Covenant Class at the end of our last two years, returns to teach a three week course on...New Understanding; New Challenges: Unpacking Secrets of Biblical Literature: **May 1:** Abraham is tested by God. And, it would seem, he passes the test with flying colors. Abraham, according to Jewish and Christian exegetical tradition, is the model of obedience. But what happens when we discover that two writers were at work in Genesis 22? A story that seems to be about obedience turn into its opposite -- a story in which Abraham clearly disobeys God. Is there a new message we need to hear from this famous passage? **May2:** The Israelites are punished for their wayward ways. Jerusalem is destroyed, as is the First Temple of Solomon. The Book of Lamentations describes the disaster in painful, moving terms. But Daughter Zion (Jerusalem) is not content to describe the horror she experiences. She confronts and challenges God, even going so far as to accuse Yahweh of mass murder. What happens when we explore the text in context and with the Hebrew fully in mind? What does such a narrative offer us in our day and age?

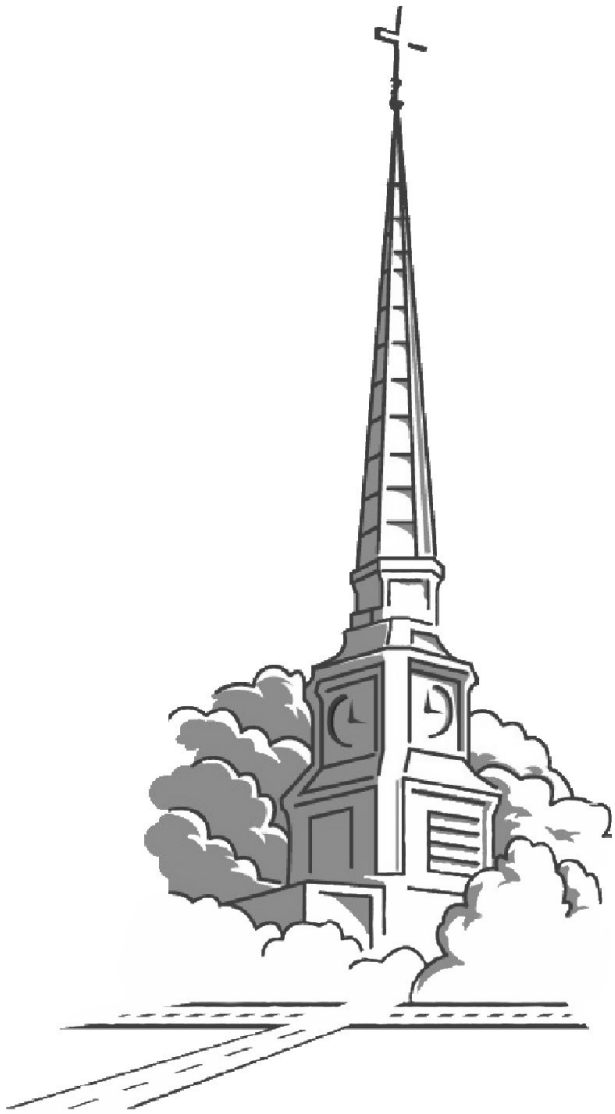
