Henry County 7th-12th Grade "Making the Best Better" 4-H JR/SR District Project Achievement March 4-6, 2016

Henry County seventh through twelfth grade 4-H'ers competed against 37 counties at 4-H Northwest Junior/Senior District Project Achievement, March 4 through the 6. There were 317 seventh and eighth graders and 358 ninth through twelfth graders for a total of 675 Northwest District 4-H'ers that competed during the weekend. These young people were given the opportunity to select a project area or category of their choice ranging from Health to Science of Engineering & Mechanics all the way to Food Labs and Performing Arts. Each member created a yearlong portfolio to be judged displaying all of their work in their project area, as well as school, community service and leadership activities they have completed over the past year. Then during the weekend the 4-H'ers were judged on their presentation or performance. Those that competed in categories such as Science of Engineering, Outdoor Recreation & History created a presentation using visual aids and gave a speech. The 4-H'ers that chose to do a Food Lab or Performing Arts categories cooked or performed.

Henry County was represented by twenty 4-H members over the weekend. The score from their presentation was combined with the score they received on their portfolio which was submitted in January for prior judging. Ninth through twelfth graders that placed 1st at the District Project Achievement will advance on to State Congress in July. We are very proud to announce that Piper Brown, Suzanne Palmertree and Camilla Stegall will be advancing on to State Congress in July.

Also during the weekend, Junior (7th -8th graders) and Senior (9th – 12th graders) elected Northwest District Officers for the upcoming year. These officers will help plan and lead all the upcoming district activities. Over the weekend 4-H'ers running for board gave a campaign speech and campaigned throughout the weekend. Every county selected six individuals as voting delegates to represent them at the polls. This year Piper Brown from Ola High and Richard Faulkner from Luella High ran for a seat on the 2016-2017 Senior Northwest Board. Henry County 4-H also had Dawson Babischkin from Luella Middle serve on 2015-2016 Junior Northwest Board.
