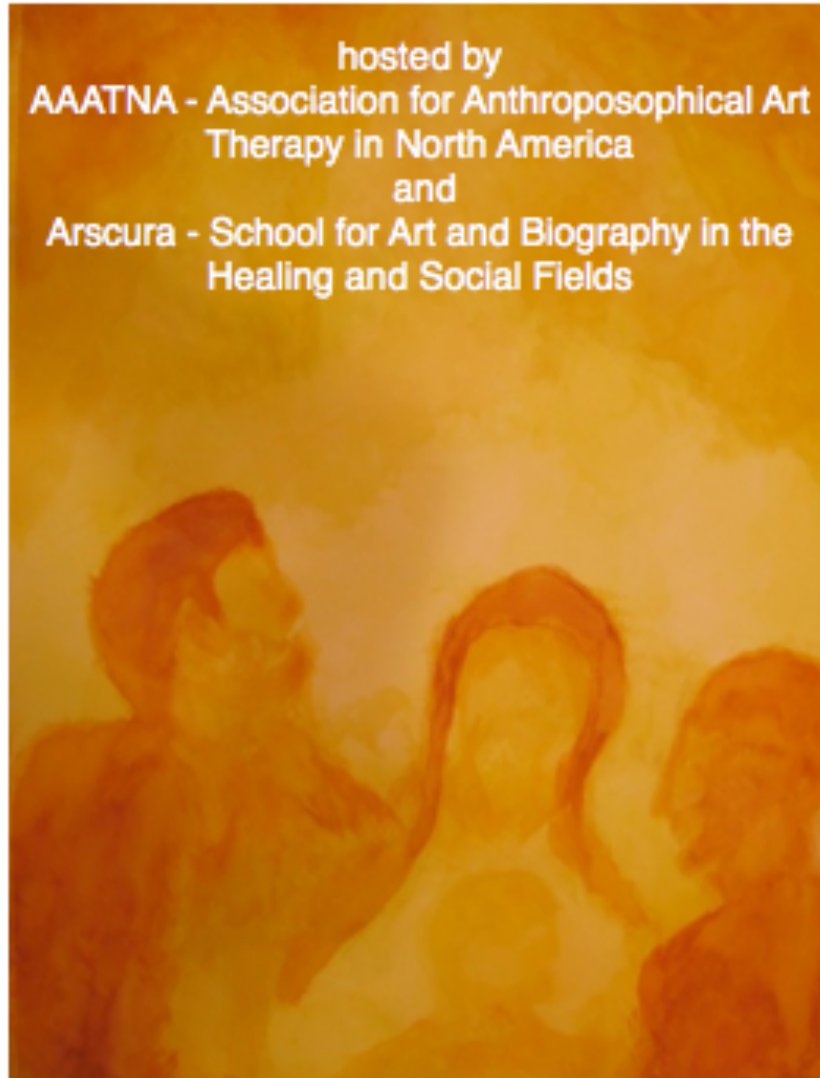

He is the co-author of *Vision in Action: Working with Soul and Spirit in Small Organizations*, and in 2012, the author of *Partnerships of Hope: Building Waldorf School Communities*.

Signe Schaefer is the founding director of the Center for Biography and Social Art, and was for many years director of Foundation Studies at Sunbridge College. She is the author of *Why on Earth?: - Biography and the Practice of Human Becoming* (Steiner Books 2013), co-author of *Ariadne's Awakening: Taking Up the Threads of Consciousness*, and co-editor of *More Lifeways*.
