GirlSTEM is a summer program for girls entering grades 5-8 to introduce careers in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM).




For every session, kids must be escorted and signed in and out of class by a parent or guardian.

Billionaire Camp


This class is full of hands-on financial activities where girls will explore personal finances, basic economics, and smart money choices. Girls will be introduced to barter systems and work to trade their way
