Solness's Faustian Bargain

There is no question that Goethe's *Faust* is among the sources contributing to the creation of Ibsen's major drama of ambition and destruction, *The Master Builder*. In fact, however, both Goethe and Ibsen were also drawing upon an international body of folk literature involving deals with the devil or a devilish figure. Early in his career Ibsen received a governmental grant to study such folk tales and clearly used motifs from them in many of his plays. This lecture will look at the folk tales that seem to have inspired Ibsen in the creation of his play, resulting in some striking parallels between the German and the Norwegian dramatic texts.
