Types of CJJ Membership

State Advisory Groups

- ✓ SAG memberships encompass all current Governor-appointed volunteers
- Membership also includes Juvenile Justice Specialists, DMC Coordinators, and Compliance Monitors

Individual Members

- ✓ Individual Members join CJJ because they are interested in juvenile justice reform
- ✓ Includes juvenile justice practitioners, service providers, parents, public officials, concerned citizens, and others

Youth Members

- ✓ Youth Members are individuals under the age of 25 who have an interest in juvenile justice reform
- ✓ Includes full- and part-time students, interns, and young professionals

Organizational Members

- ✓ Organizational Members are organizations who are interested in juvenile justice reform
- ✓ Includes nonprofits, private companies, foundations, and others organizations
