A MESSAGE FROM JON, Director of Youth and Young Adults

MEANING THE WORDS WE SAY AND SING

I did not come from a faith tradition that said the Lord's Prayer or Apostle's Creed often, like we do at First Church. We did not say a confession together, and we did not incorporate any "call and response" liturgy. And although we did not incorporate these things together, we did have a basic order of things to follow: Welcome, Announcements, Singing, Prayer, Message, Singing, and we concluded with a spoken benediction by our Pastor, Pastor John Kulp. When Pastor Kulp spoke the benediction, you could feel the warmth of his love for the flock of believers that were under his care. He meant every word that he spoke.

In the pews, when we sang our hymns, there were some days where you felt really connected to the wonderful words on the hymnal's page, and other days where, although you may have been passionate, you may have been more passionate about the tone of your voice rather than the word's impact on your heart.

Hymns are wonderful, wonderful masterpieces of praises to God that have lasted through the years. In thinking about these songs, they have comforted, encouraged, and strengthened many Christians for many years. It's truly astounding to think of all of the worship one hymn can help lead.

But if we glaze over the words...where is the meaning in that?

BEAUTIFUL LITURGY

Each Sunday morning, we gather to worship our Lord together. One Church. One Baptism. One Lord.

At First Church, we worship God through Prayer, Song, Message, Apostle's Creed, Lord's Prayer, Confession, and a "Call and Response" type of worship style. The Pastors say one thing, the congregation says the next.

It's easy to let these wonderful words that we say become dull in their ability to pierce our soul, due to years of use. When we overlook the meaning behind the words that we speak and sing, we may focus on getting the mode of worship right, rather truly worshiping the Lord through the heart behind the words.

The Lord's Prayer is a wonderful thing. It starts with acknowledging the Lordship of God over our lives, and seeking His Will above our own — as it is in heaven. It then communicates our need for His sustenance and His aid in saying "Give us this day our daily bread." In being FILLED with the Lord's provision, we ask Him to forgive us of our debts (sins), as we forgive our debtors (as we forgive those who sin against us). In walking in this forgiveness, we beseech the Lord to keep us far from temptation, and to deliver us from the evil that would seek to cripple our walk in the Lord's righteousness. And the prayer closes with the acknowledgment of God's complete rule over all of life, over our lives, and how He is deserving of our earnest praise. Amen.

The Apostle's Creed is a BOLD proclamation of what we believe. Christian men and women have DIED for holding to these very same beliefs; refusing to denounce that CHRIST IS GOD even if by that denial their physical body would be spared of earthly torment and death. This Creed has been said by Christians for HUNDREDS of years, and like saying the Lord's Prayer, we join millions of Christians around the globe in affirming the same words in worship to the same God together. Amen.

WORSHIPFUL HEARTS

God does not desire for us to say or sing mere words on a page. He desires us to worship Him, and we can do so through saying or singing those words with a worshipful and engaged heart. If we apathetically let these words of worship pass through our lips, it would be better if we were to choose to remain silent, so that we can remain honest to ourselves, and honest to God. You likely will not cry or show emotion with every song, prayer, or creed, but sing and say these words with Conviction, Trust, and Humility.

In the Old Testament, King David wrote about this very same idea. He wrote about how God desires the hearts behind people bringing an animal to sacrifice, rather than just the sacrifice in isolation of a person's sincere and humble worship. David wrote the following in Psalm 51:15–17:

O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise. For you will not delight in sacrifice, or I would give it; you will not be pleased with a burnt offering. The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise. (ESV)

The Lord desires our hearts in complete worship. We are imperfect, so we will not always find the meaning in the words we read, say, or sing... but I believe that God desires for us to be seeking how we could improve in this.

As someone who did not come from a church that said the Lord's Prayer or the Creed often, I have grown to appreciate them, and I earnestly seek that my words are spoken out of a heart of worship. When I join with you all on a Sunday morning in saying these words, sometimes I take a moment to listen to those around me, all affirming their faith, and it's truly a beautiful thing.

As we say these words and sing the hymns of faith, let us continually keep our hearts in check, and always know that we are gathered together to worship a God, whose love for each and every one of us is beyond any love that we have ever known, and we can never fully grasp the depth of His mercy and grace.

"For Thine is the Kingdom, and the Power, and the Glory, Forever. Amen."
