Pursuant to House Bill 1318 83rd Texas Legislature



House Bill 1318

Not later than January 1, 2015, the Texas Indigent Defense Commission shall conduct and publish a study for the purpose of determining guidelines for establishing a maximum allowable caseload for a criminal defense attorney that... allows the attorney to give each indigent defendant the time and effort necessary to ensure effective representation.






Texas Path to Indigent Defense Caseloads

1. Attorney Timekeeping



- 196 attorneys
- Average 15 years' experience
- Telephone recruitment from 39 largest counties
- 60,000 time entries; 8,151 cases

How much time "is" currently being spent on the defense of court-appointed criminal cases?

2. Time Sufficiency Survey



- 319 attorneys
- Average 18 years' experience
- Large county appointment lists and TCDLA member roster

- Iterative process of anonymous surveys and group discussion to reach consensus

HB 1318 Charge

WHAT IS REQUIRED FOR AN:

"ATTORNEY TO GIVE EACH INDIGENT DEFENDANT THE TIME AND EFFORT NECESSARY TO ENSURE EFFECTIVE REPRESENTATION"

"STUDY MUST BE BASED ON RELEVANT POLICIES, PERFORMANCE GUIDELINES, AND BEST PRACTICES"





Weighted Caseload Study RESULTS


Additional Time Required






Additional Time Required



Fiscal Impact








