WEE BEGINNER (0 – 18 months) – Foot Print Penguin

What You Need:

- White, black and orange paper
- Black and white paint
- Paint brushes
- Scissors
- Glue stick

What You Do:

1. Paint your foot white, then outline with black.
2. Stamp your painted foot onto a piece of paper.
3. Paint your thumb black and stamp on both sides of the penguin.
4. Cut out small circles out of black paper.
5. Dab some glue on it. Paste as the eyes.
6. Cut a triangle out of orange paper and paste as the beak.



WEE EXPLORER (18months – 3 years old) – Melted Snowman

What You Need:

- Blue, black, brown, orange and red paper
- White paint
- Glue stick
- Scissors

What You Do:

1. On the blue paper put some white paint on it and let your child paint around with their hands.
2. While the child is painting, cut out 2 eyes and a hat with the black paper, 2 arms with the brown paper, a triangle nose with the orange paper and a scarf with the red paper.
3. Once your child is done painting, allow it to dry and let your child glue on the items you have cut out any way they want for their melted snowman.





WEE BUILDER (3 – 4 years old) – Watercolour Snowflakes

What You Need:

- White paper
- White crayon
- Blue paint
- Paper plate
- Cup of water
- Paint brush
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Circle shape to trace (optional)

What You Do:

1. Find a circle shape in the size you want and trace or free hand and draw a circle.
2. With scissors, cut out multiple circle shapes.
3. With the white crayon, have your child draw a snowflake making sure they press hard on the crayon.
4. Once they are done have the child wet the paintbrush and dip into the blue paint and swirl on the plate to thin it down.
5. Once the paint is thinned down your child can paint it over the circle and watch the snowflake appear.





WEE LEARNER (4 – 5 years old) – Snow Globe

What You Need:

- Clear plastic cup
- Cardboard
- Small picture of your child
- White tissue paper
- Blue and white craft foam
- Pencil
- Clear tape
- Pipe cleaner
- White glue
- Scissors



What You Do:

1. Take a picture of your child and resize it to fit into the plastic cup.
2. Print out the photo and cut it out.
3. Use the bottom of the plastic cup to trace onto the cardboard. Cut it out and have your child tape their picture to the cardboard circle.
4. With the pencil poke a hole at the top of the plastic cup and insert the pipe cleaner and secure it.
5. Have your child cut out shapes for the background of the snow globe.
6. With the white glue have your child glue the foam pieces to the inside of the plastic cup. This will be the background.
7. Have your child cut/tear stripes of tissue paper and crumple it up.
8. Put the down right side up on the table and fill it half way with the crumpled up tissue paper.
9. Line the rim of the cup with white glue and place the cardboard with the picture facing in and allow it to dry.
10. Once it is dry, turn the cup over and hang in a place where everyone can see.

WEE EXPERT (5 – 6 years old) – “S” is for Snowman

What You Need:

- White, black, orange, and blue paper
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Glue

What You Do:

1. Free hand an “S” on the white paper and a circle for the head of the snowman.
2. Glue the circle head to the top of the “S”.
3. Draw small circles and a hat shape on the black paper and have your child cut them out. Glue the black circles as eyes, mouth, and buttons and glue the hat on top of the head.
4. On the orange paper draw and cut out a carrot shape for the nose and glue on the face.
5. With the blue paper, cut out a stripe and glue onto the hat.



WEE MENTOR (6+ years old) – Yarn Wrapped Star Decoration

What You Need:

- Cardstock or cardboard
- Colourful yarn
- Scissors
- Tape
- A star-shaped cookie cutter or other star template to trace



What You Do:

1. Trace your star shape onto the cardstock and cut it out (or for kids who are getting good with cutting with scissors, have them cut out the star themselves).
2. Tape the end of your yarn into a loop about an inch from one of the tips of your star.
3. Then, set your child loose, wrapping the yarn around the star shape like crazy! They can cover the whole star, or leave some of the cardstock showing underneath – either way; the final product is really cute!
