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## WEE BEGINNER (0 – 18 months) – Handprint Polar Bear

### What You Need:

- Light blue construction paper
- White paint
- Paint brush
- Black marker
- Scissors

### What You Do:

1. Paint your child's hand with white paint.
2. Place it onto the light blue construction paper and allow to dry.
3. With the scissors, cut out the handprint.
4. Draw in the details of eyes, ears, nose and mouth with black marker.





## Wee Explorers (18 months-3 years): Cup of Hot Cocoa

### What You Need:

- Coloured construction paper
- Stickers
- Brown paint
- Paint brush
- Cotton balls
- Glue
- Pencil



### What You Do:

1. Cut out the shape of a mug from your coloured construction paper.
2. Draw a half moon shape at the top to represent the opening of the mug.
3. Have you child paint the top with brown paint.
4. While the paint is drying have your child decorate the mug with stickers.
5. Glue the cotton balls on top.







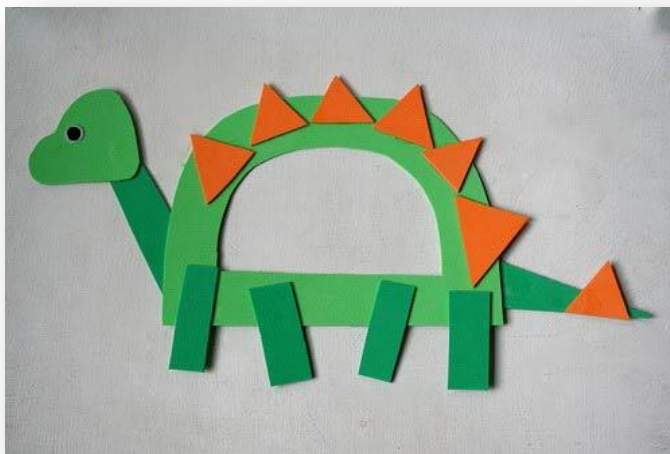
## Wee Builder (3 – 4 years): “D” is for Dinosaur

### What You Need:

- Glue
- Green and Orange Paper
- Scissors
- Black Marker

### What To Do:

1. Cut out an uppercase D out of the green paper and a dinosaur’s head.
2. On the remaining green paper draw rectangles for the legs and a neck. Draw a triangle for the tail.
3. On the orange paper draw triangles for the dinosaur’s spikes.
4. Let the child cut out the shapes you have just drawn and have them glue it to the letter D.
5. With the black marker draw in the eye.





## Wee Learner (4 - 5 years): Matching Mittens

### What You Need:

- Coloured construction paper
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Paint
- Paint brushes

### What You Do:

1. Fold your construction paper in half.
2. Draw an outline of a mitten.
3. Cut out the mitten keeping the folded edge intact.
4. Have your child paint a design on one side and before it dries, fold the mitten back together and then open.







## Wee Experts (5 - 6 years): Paper Plate Cars

### What You Need:

- Large Paper Plate
- Favourite Coloured Tissue Paper
- White/Black Cardstock
- Glue
- Scissors
- Stapler



### What You Do:

1. First cut your paper plate in half. This will give you two cars.
2. Now take your tissue paper and cut it into small squares {let the kids practice their cutting skills}
3. Take your paper plate halves and put a good amount of glue all over them. Have children place the tissue paper on top of the glue, until they are completely covered.
4. When they are done with that, set aside to let them dry completely while you trim out the other car features from your cardstock like tires, windows, lights, etc.
5. Have your child glue on the details of the car and allow to dry.





## Wee Mentors (6+ years): Emoji Masks

### What You Need:

- Yellow poster board
- White, brown, black, red and pink paper
- Scissors
- Glue
- Large popsicle sticks

### What You Do:

1. Trace and cut a large circle (The masks in the image on the right is a circle made with an 11 inch diameter bowl).
2. Determine emoji face designs. You can try making heart eyes, sunglasses and tongue designs. Cut out pieces.
3. Glue pieces on faces.
4. Glue the large popsicle stick onto the back of mask.
