



2014 Proposed Ballot Questions Banning or Restricting Energy Production

75 – Authorizes ongoing elections in all 271 cities and 64 counties to supersede state law, rewriting rules and regulations for any business operating in their jurisdictions. The measure would allow cities and counties “to define or eliminate the rights and powers of corporations or business entities” regardless of state or federal law.

82 – Allows cities and counties to “restrict the time, place or manner or oil and gas development, including but not limited to prohibitions” regardless of state law.

85 – Increases the setback for new oil and gas wells to 1,500 feet. Asserts this is not a taking.

86 – Increases the setback for new oil and gas wells to 2,000 feet. Asserts this is not a taking.

87 – Increases the setback for new oil and gas wells to a half-mile. Asserts this is not a taking.

88 – Increases the setback for new oil and gas wells to 2,000 feet.

89 – Allows cities and counties to enact general environmental laws or regulations that are more restrictive than the state’s.

90 – Allows cities and counties to “prohibit or limit oil and gas development” with local laws and regulations that are “more restrictive” than the state’s.

91 – Allows cities and counties to “prohibit or limit oil and gas operations” with local laws and regulations that are “more restrictive” than the state’s.

92 – Allows cities and counties to “enact prohibitions or limits on oil and gas development” that are “more restrictive” than the state’s.

93 – Allows cities and counties to “limit oil and gas development” with laws and regulations that are “more restrictive” than the state’s.

103 – Grants any Colorado citizen standing to file suit over enforcement of environmental laws.

All of the proposals would amend the Colorado Constitution.
