SCOPE OF PROBLEM

- 1 in 6 online teens say they have been contacted online by someone they did not know in a way that made them feel scared or uncomfortable (2013)
- 44% of youth have lied about their age to gain access to restricted websites and online accounts (2013)
- 95% of all teens 12-17 are now online and 80% of online teens are users of social media sites (2011)
- 9 out of 10 children between 8 and 16 have viewed pornography on the internet...most unintentionally
