Carolyn Schnurr oversees development and management of humane federal legislation with a focus on equine issues. She works with members of Congress and legislative staff to ensure their support for the ASPCA's legislative priorities. On behalf of the ASPCA, Carolyn testifies before state congressional bodies and governmental boards, conducts media interviews and gives presentations nationwide on legislative initiatives impacting equines. She developed her legal expertise in equine issues at a California wild horse sanctuary, where she focused on the Wild Free-Roaming Horses and Burros Act, and at the Maine State Society for the Protection of Animals, where she provided legal assistance in horse cruelty situations. Carolyn hails from Kentucky and earned her J.D. from the University of Maine School of Law. She now lives in Maryland with her two rescued companions: her greyhound, Ruby ("Roo"), and her cat, Amelia.
