

AP TESTING

THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

In order to have a successful testing experience, you should be aware of what is expected of you and what the conditions will be in the testing room. Check each test for starting times as they vary depending on the AP test. Testing begins promptly at the time listed so you are expected to be seated and ready to go at that time. Please **be in your seat ready.***** We will be testing downstairs in the labs unless specified on the schedule. There will be NO LATE ENTRY.

What to Bring to the Exam Room

- Several sharpened No. 2 pencils with erasers for all responses on your multiple-choice answer sheet.
- Pens with black or dark blue ink for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free response questions in most exams.
- Your six digit school code. **441-838**
- An approved calculator with the necessary capabilities if you are taking the AP Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, or Statistics Exams. Visit www.collegeboard.com/ap/calculators to learn more about the calculator policy for these exams, and for a list of authorized calculators.
- Your social security number for identification purposes (optional). If you provide it, the number will appear on your score report.
- **A hoodie or sweater** in case the room gets too cool. Please dress appropriately.

What **Not** to Bring to the Exam Room

- Cell phones and any electronic devices, personal digital assistants, smart phones and any communication devices. **YOU MAY NOT ENTER THE ROOM WITH ANY OF THESE DEVICES.**
- Books, compasses, mechanical pencils, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, notes, colored pencils.
- Scratch paper; notes can be made on portions of the exam booklets.
- Watches that beep or have an alarm.
- Portable listening devices
- Computers

After the testing, you will receive your AP Student Packet. **KEEP YOUR PACKET.** This packet is unique to you. Your student number is inside that packet and will be needed if you ever decide to forward your scores to college. Keep it in a safe place for a few years. Students years later decide to send scores to college but do not have any identifying number to locate these scores. Also, students can access their scores by phone in July before the scores are actually sent to your home. You will need the number to have your scores given by phone and to access other information and services.
