Overview of the Greenwich Public Schools

Magnet Application Guidelines

The Greenwich Public Schools (GPS) provides an opportunity for families to choose to send their children to one of five elementary or middle magnet schools through an annual application process. The GPS Magnet program is designed to:

1. provide parents and students with options to personalize educational opportunities based on individual preferences
2. balance enrollment among the elementary and middle schools on a voluntary basis

Programs and Services: GPS Magnet Schools provide the same curriculum, programs and services as all other Greenwich public elementary/middle schools. In addition, magnet schools offer a particular instructional framework and/or features that are unique to the individual schools.

Lottery Process: Each of the GPS Magnet schools are also neighborhood schools, with students enrolled from within the designated attendance area. A limited number of magnet seats are available by application for students residing outside the magnet schools' attendance areas. If more applications are received than there are seats available, a lottery is conducted.

Applicant Eligibility: Any resident of the Town of Greenwich with school-age children is eligible to apply to a GPS Magnet School. Non-resident Town of Greenwich (TOG) employees are also eligible to apply to GPS magnet schools; Non-resident TOG applications will be considered after Greenwich resident applications are filled.

STEM Magnet School



Hamilton Avenue School (HAS) is the District's first Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) school. STEM education ignites interest and uses an inquiry approach to develop the skills and knowledge that prepares students for expanding college and career opportunities. In a state-of-the-art building, built in 2009, with a science lab and television studio, HAS was one of the first two Greenwich Public Schools to launch a Digital Learning Environment in 2012. HAS offers world language instruction in Spanish in grades K-5, Suzuki Violin (PreK-5), and smaller average class sizes in grades K and 1.
